Dear Friends of Moorlands,

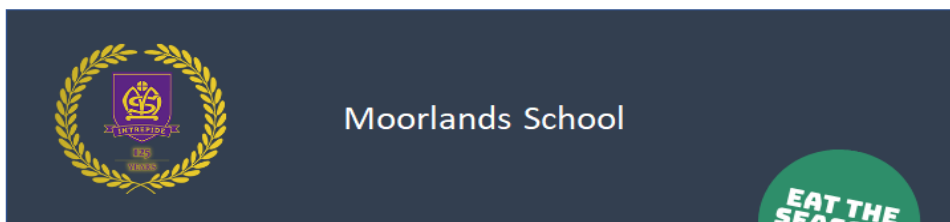
